Fluent

Has a native-like fluency and operational command. The level of oral communication, writing and reading skills are fully accepted by educated native speakers in all of their features, including vocabulary, structure, idiom, and relevant cultural references.

Proficient

Has advanced knowledge of vocabulary, and grammatical patterns, and can operate in all skills easily. Errors occur while producing the language, but can function in unfamiliar contexts with skill.

Functional

Can use the language adequately in work, social, and travel contexts but makes frequent errors, a few of which impede meaning and require rephrasing. There is little or no familiarity with language varieties.

Limited

Able to satisfy minimal travel needs and courtesy requirements, can interact and read passages on very familiar topics with limited vocabulary. Can produce simple short sentences but makes frequent errors in pronunciation, grammar, and basic sentence patterns.

Applicants who feel that they have not attained the Proficient level in English should provide a test score or a letter of recommendation to be considered for this program:
