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APPENDIX A: Debate Information and Academic Word List Wordbank

Debate: Cats Vs. Dogs

Team A: You will argue that cats make better pets than dogs.Team B: You will argue that dogs make better pets than cats.

(Teams will be decided by a coin toss.)

The debate will have three parts:

- 1. *Opening statements*: Each team will choose one person to make a short opening statement in which (s)he will state the team's opinion about the topic. (Each team has 1 minute.)
- 2. Open debate: Raise your hand to make a point or ask the other side a question. Each member of your team should have at least one response or point to make. Everyone *must* participate. Once you are called on, you have a maximum of 1 minute to make your point. The other side will then be given an opportunity to respond. Each side must have *at least three* clear arguments to support your position.
- 3. *Closing statements*: Each team will choose another person to make a short closing statement that summarizes your team's opinion. Use different words from your opening statement. (Each team has 1 minute.)

In your debate team, assign different roles, such as a speaker for your opening statement, a speaker for your closing statement, counterargument/rebuttal specialists, and Academic Word List specialists.
