- be subject to editing for grammar, length, and style

- a brief cover letter outlining which topic you wish to write about
- 10 sample titles (each title should be 60 characters or fewer, including spaces, and should accurately reflect the content of the post)
- one sample posting, with title: An example posting that is representative of your general blog content (700 words or fewer)
- a brief author bio (100 words or fewer), and a professional-looking photograph

This call is open until all positions are filled.
