- Use a decision support tool for guidance in making choices

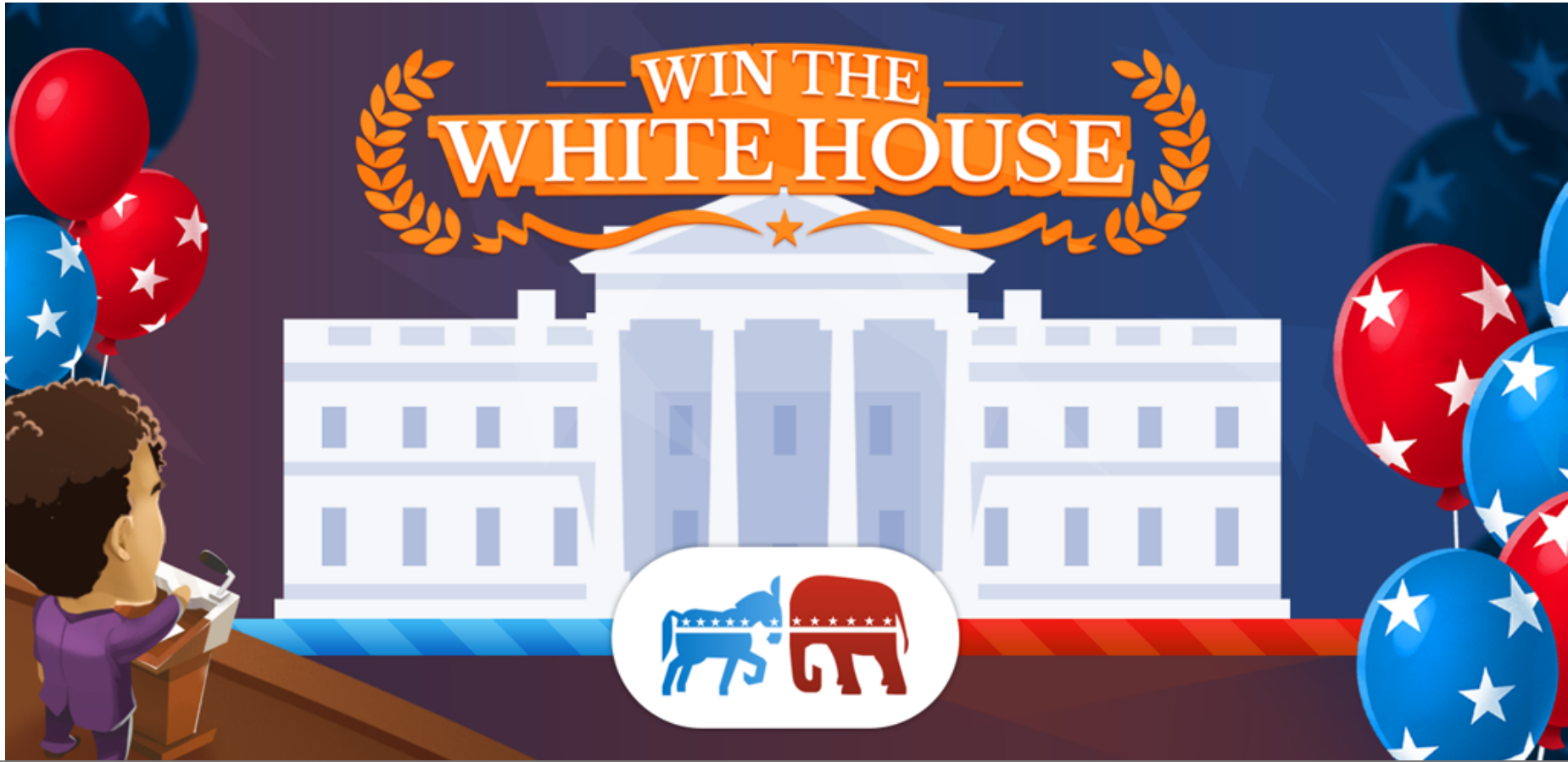






In *Immigration Nation* your students guide newcomers on a path to citizenship. They can play in classic or puzzle mode.
