## **Questions for Discussion and Application**

- 4.1. What are some strategies and best practices from the 6 Principles that you can share with non-ESL academic faculty to assist in their teaching to Adult learners of English? Create a list of techniques and strategies that work best in your IEP program. Discuss how you can help faculty adopt these strategies to their teaching and learning contexts.
- 4.2. In the book, we reference different strategies to grow in the field and engage within a community of practice. Identify the type of professional development opportunities available to you and your colleagues. Do you leverage the resources available to you (academic journals, books, technology training)? Identify opportunities in your department, on campus, community or online. Discuss your specific needs and identify ways to work with your administration to help support your professional growth and that of your colleagues.
