Here is the game that you can use it in language learning classes.

1. Act out a sentence

Level (Grade 4-12)

Goal: Practice of the target language, funny icebreaker game

How to do it:

Ask the learners to line up and stand in a straight line and all of them face a direction one after

another. Write a sentence like "I am eating a hamburger" in a piece of paper. Show the

sentence to the learner at the front of the line, with no words or sounds. Everyone else will have

their backs turned to you, except for the learner at the front. Learner A who is reading the paper

should not ask any questions or talk. Learner A turns her back to you, taps learner B on the

shoulder. As learner B turns around learner A starts acting out the sentence using no words and

learner B only watches. After learner A is done, learner B taps learner C on the shoulder asks

him /her to watch her imitating learner A. The cycle will go on until the last learner watches the

person before him acting. The last learner has to guess what the sentence was. The last player

says the word or phrase aloud so that everyone can hear how much it has changed from the first

person at the beginning of the line.

**Suggested Actions:** 

1. Go fishing in a boat, catch a fish, and let it go back to the sea.

2. Walk to the refrigerator, get an apple, slice it, and then eat it.

3. Turn on a television, watch a football game, eat popcorn, and cheer for goals.

4. Drive a car fast, have an accident, and visit a hospital.

5. Look out of a window; shout at someone who is trying to steal your car.
