PROJECT: MY LIFE

<u>Objective</u>: Create a 4 – 6 minute power point presentation describing your family, house, and life in general. This is an ORAL PRESENTATION.

You will include:

- 8 to 12 slides with pictures of your family, friends, house, activities you do, etc...
- One of the first slides must have a family tree with your immediate family included (or more family members if your family is small). Don't forget to include pets if you would like.
- Each slide will have a short description in English describing or labeling them. <u>You may not have full sentences on your slides this is an oral presentation.</u>
- You will use note cards as prompts for your presentation, but you may not simply read. You are not allowed to have full sentences on your note cards, just an outline, key words, ideas, etc... you will lose points if you read!
- You need to describe your family members with physical characteristics as well as personality. Describe your house, your daily activities, your favorite activities... you will also need to describe what you were like as a child, as well as pick one specific past event and tell the story of that event. For example, a family vacation or school event with friends. You will narrate this story in the past.
- Please follow directions and make sure you include everything expressed in this Rubric. Make sure it is no less than 4 minutes, no more than 6. Make sure you have at least 8 slides and at the most 12. Make sure you have an actual family tree on one of your first slides. Make sure you are creative, write out what you want to say and practice. Make sure you do not bring up any whole sentences or written essay in front of the class to read off of. Make sure you use all appropriate grammar.
- You will need to hand in all your written notes (except your note cards with <u>ONLY</u> trigger words and ideas) in to me before you start your presentation. <u>YOU HAVE</u> <u>TO WRITE AN "ESSAY" OF WHAT YOU ARE GOING TO SAY AND HAND IT IN.</u> Even though you are not going to be graded on your written essay, you will lose 20 points off the top if you do not hand in your written essay. You will also hand in your prompt note cards at the end of your presentation.
- Your presentation must be fluid and practiced, but not read!!!!!!!
